Timeline for the project - when did it start?

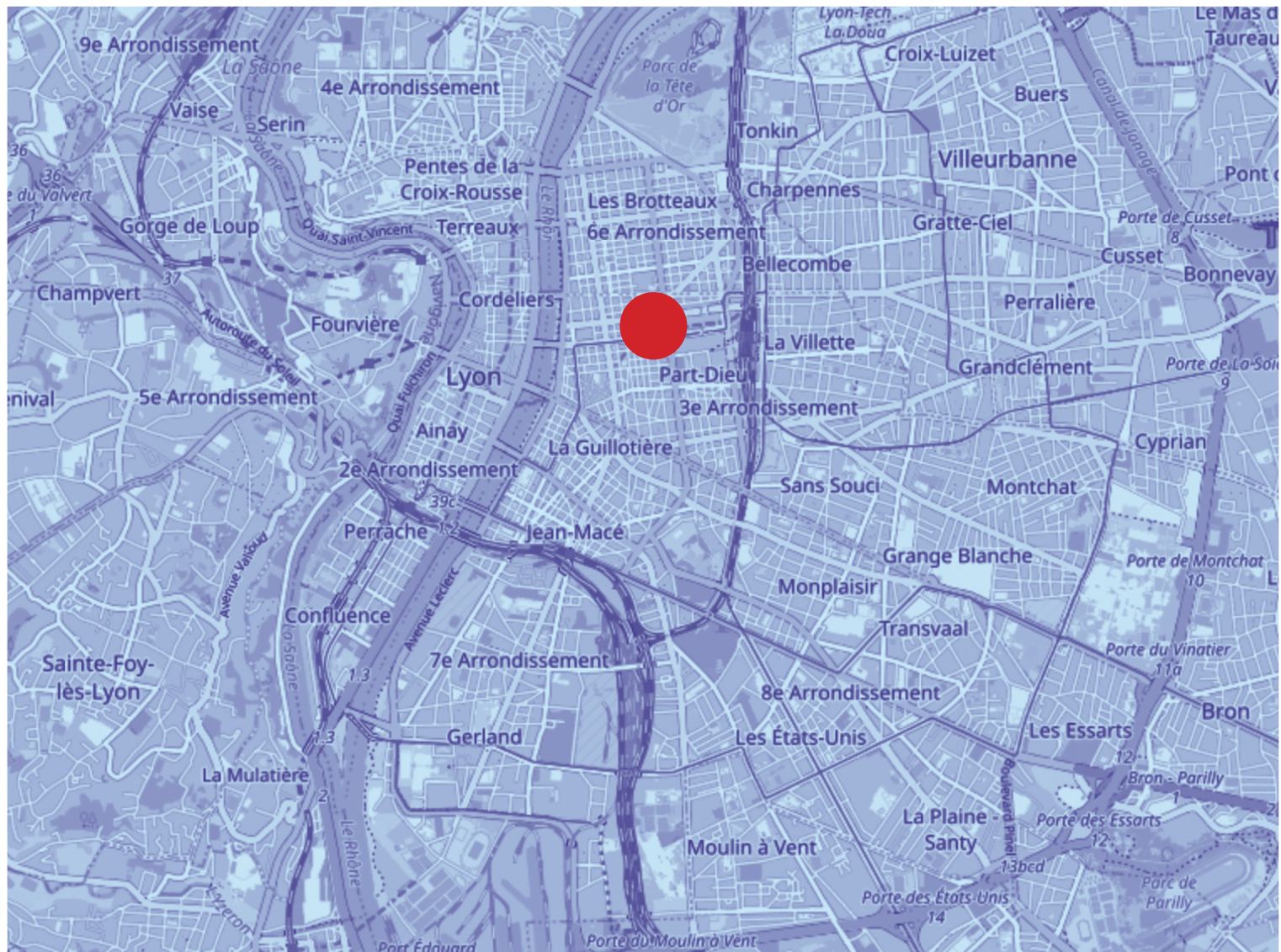

How to support migrants with a HF approach

Target audience for the project

La Base welcomes and supports single mothers (migrants) in great precarity and their children under three years old in tiny houses, functional micro-homes allowing them to regain the privacy and respite necessary to rebuild themselves and integrate into the Metropolis.

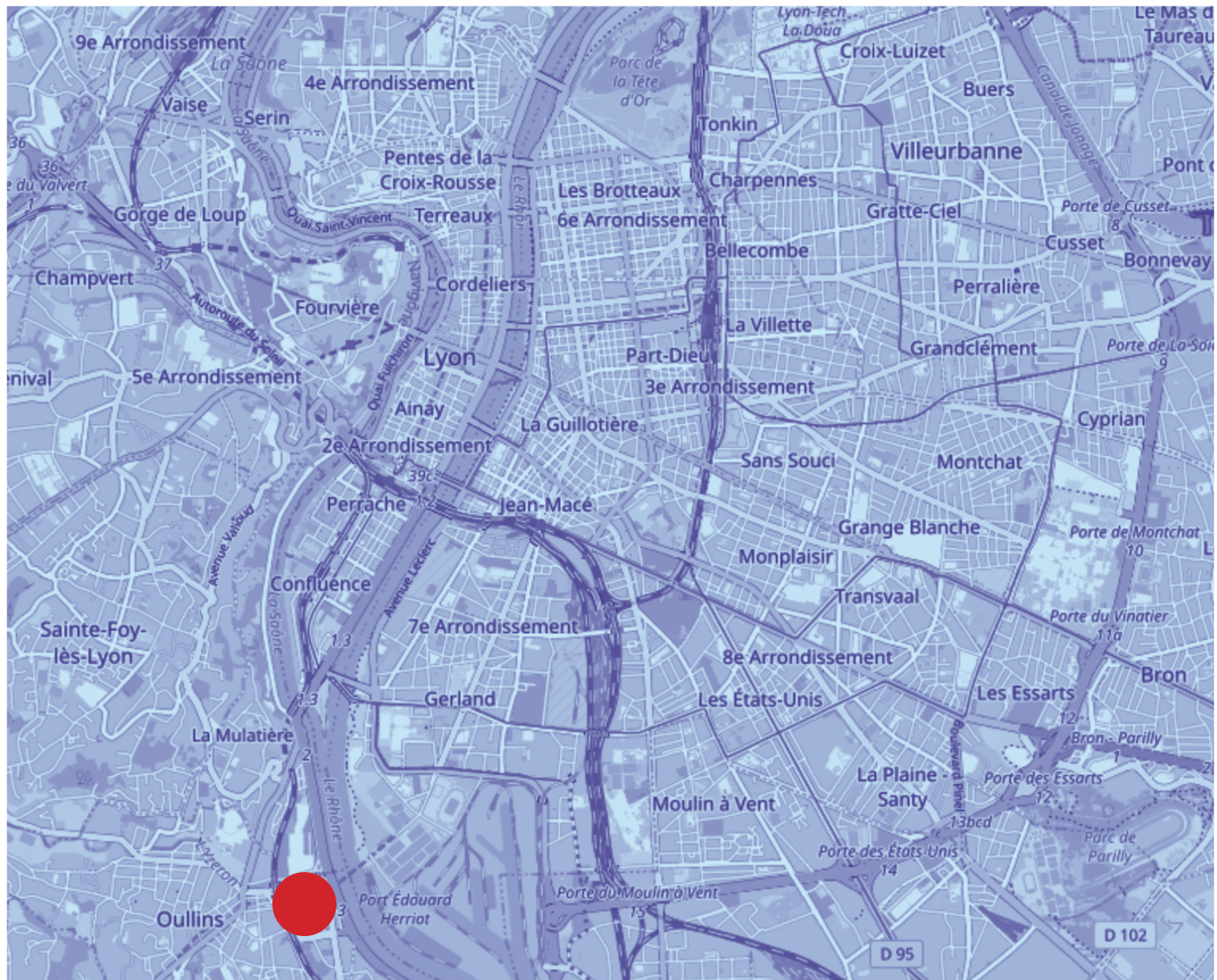
Timeline for the project - when did it start?

March 2021

Project highlights

La Base is an emergency accommodation center that welcomes single mothers with at least one child under the age of three. Our mission is to provide shelter and the basic needs, with social support. In the long term, we help each family obtain housing when administrative conditions allow it.

Tiny houses offer privacy and family life that allow for peaceful community living. Mutual help and support among residents are encouraged.

Women with children under 3 years old or unborn

Timeline for the project - when did it start?

The project started in May 2023. It follows the opening of another place called "Les Amazones" in the 9th district of Lyon.

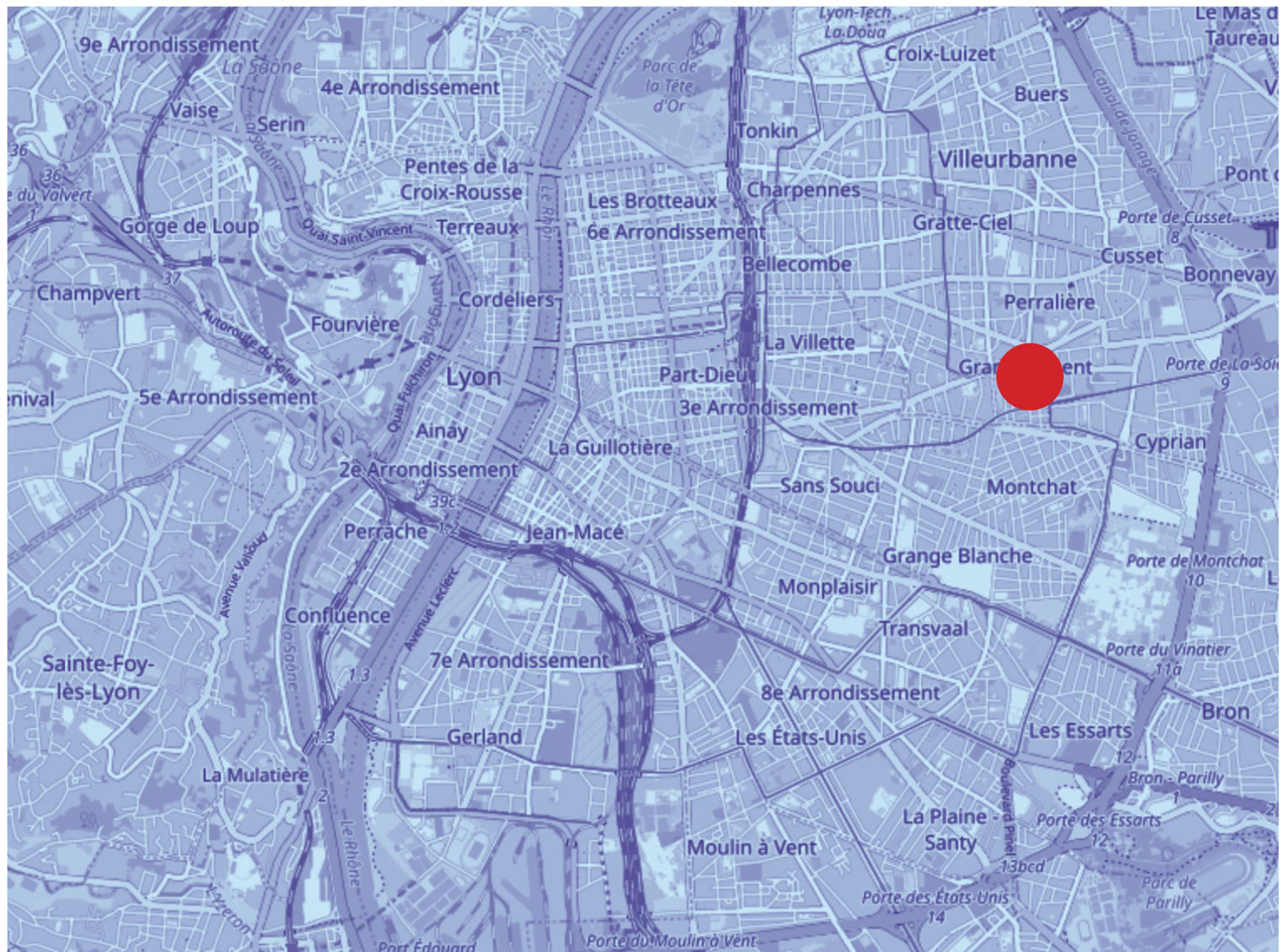

We act as a link between them and the people hosted on the site. We jointly carry out preventive and educational actions related to parenting

Project highlights

The social support offered to sheltered individuals is based on their ability to take action, on their own empowerment. The administrative situation of individuals upon their arrival varies for each person. If they have the right to stay, we work on issues related to access to employment and independent housing. If they do not have the right to stay in France, we work to improve this situation. At the same time, we support them with the various difficulties they encounter (parenting, learning French, ...).

How to house the “most marginalized” using HF principles

Target audience for the project

Enables 22 homeless people, who either refuse or are refused traditional housing solutions to live in a place of their choice, with the support of the collective and ongoing professional assistance. People choose the type of accommodation they wish to live: an individual chalet located on the semi-collective site or another type of housing (apartment, guesthouse, caravan, etc.). Residents invest in their living space with their pets (when applicable) and take into account their addictions, if they have any.

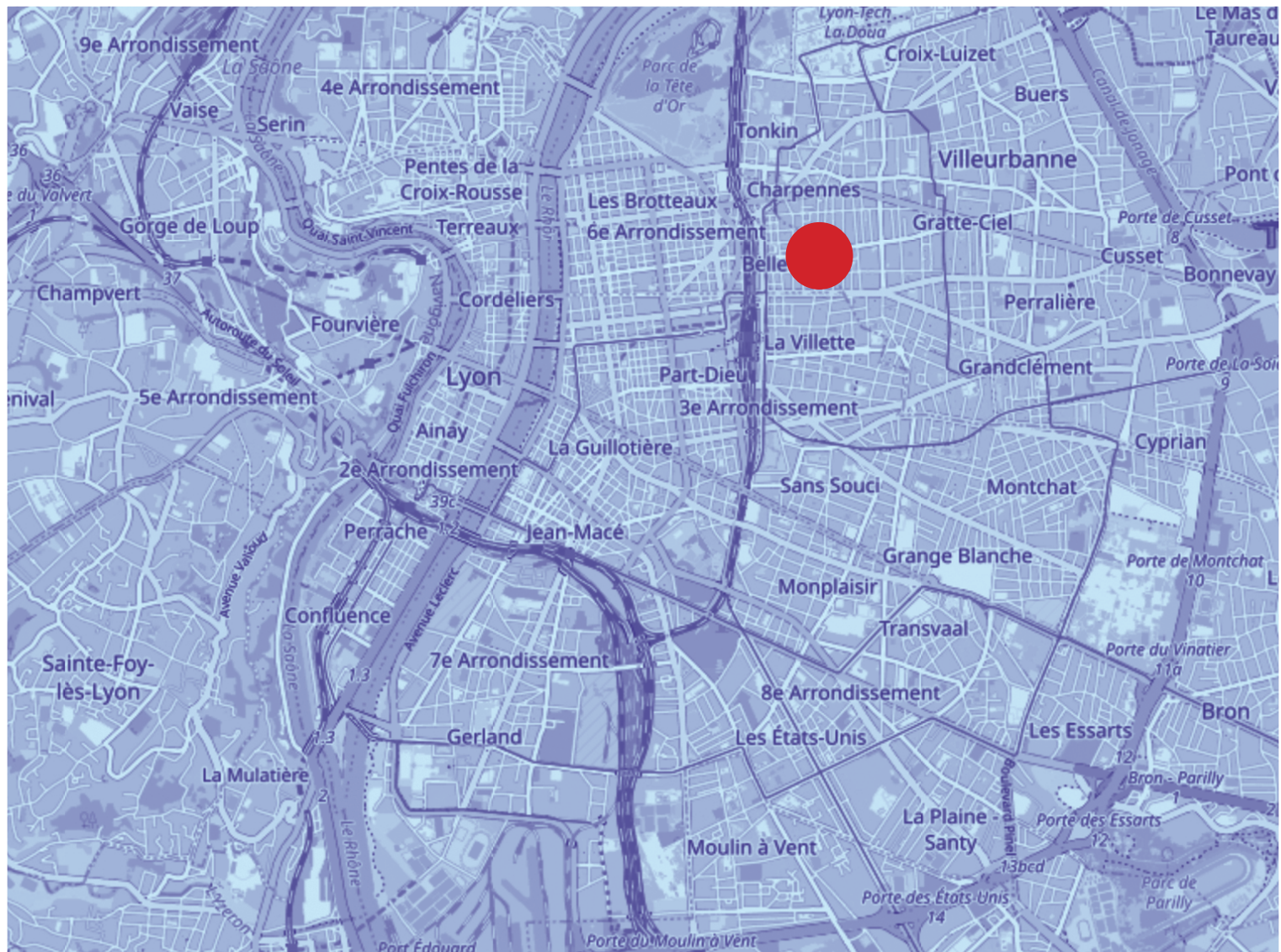

Resource center for people in precarious situations and citizen reception

Target audience for the project

A place open to everyone: locals and newcomers alike, without distinction of administrative status, financial situation or background. It welcomes associations that offer services specifically designed for people in precarious situations. But beyond providing essential assistance, it is also a space for building connections between the residents of Lyon and its metropolitan area.

Timeline for the project - when did it start?

Opening of the venue to resident associations: January 2025. Opening to the general public: March 2025

Project highlights

This place brings together organizations committed to the same cause, creating informal exchanges that strengthen the network and encourage the sharing of practices, the establishment of partnerships, and guidance toward each organization's programs. With its unconditional welcome, the place also becomes a place of respite, a landmark for people in precarious situations, and a new refuge in the area.
